Invasive Plant Walk at Macomber Woods

Framingham Garden Club's Horticultural Committee took a guided walk of Macomber Woods, lead by Nicci Cataldo of Macomber Woods to find and identify emerging invasive plants and remove them. Formally the Macomber Estate, members discovered intrusive plants such as Chinese Wisteria left from the formal gardens. Some of the invasive plants found were bittersweet, buck thorn, burning bush, garlic mustard and Virginia creeper. Members also found wild native sarsaparilla, lady slippers, jack-in-the pulpit, partridge berry, winterberry, Canadian mayflowers and Solomon seal.
