Brenda Moore, our National Garden Club President, has sent a message to the state presidents regarding future yearbook entries:

The rubric for yearbook judging at the state and region level should no longer include the address and phone number for the NGC president and NEGC director. This was changed at the national level many years ago (though now there is no yearbook award at the national level). Please change and let your clubs know.

More from NGC President Brenda Moore. She has asked us to coordinate one of her President's Projects – the *Plant America, Feed America* initiative to help fight food insecurity across the country. Right now is the peak of our growing season and many of us are harvesting the fruits of our labor in our veggie gardens. This is the time to get the word out to our members. You'll see that the flier has a direct link to the donation form National is using to track the produce (or cash or anything else donated to food banks, soup kitchens, etc.)! This makes it easy for a member to click the link to pull up the form on their screen. Many of the clubs already donate to various local charities and needy organizations. The simplest way to accomplish the request above is to record what you have donated. The amount can be pounds of food or cash donations.
