Important Dates

- Electronic Registration OPENS: Monday, December 1, 2025
- Designer Orientation Day: Monday, February 23, 2026, at 1:30 pm
- Inclement Weather Orientation Date: Monday, March 2, 2026, at 1:30 pm
- Arranging Day: Thursday, April 30, 2026 (arrangements completed by 9 am)
- Art in Bloom: Friday, May 1 Sunday, May 3, 2026
- Arrangement Pick-Up: Monday, May 4, 2026 (arrangements picked up by 9 am)



Registration Details

Register promptly - there are **50 art objects** available for interpretation, and more garden clubs than slots. Once registered you will receive an email with a link to register your floral arranging duo. Then within 2 weeks of registering you will receive confirmation of your participation or addition to waitlist.



Orientation Day

Designer Orientation Day: Monday, February 23, 2026 (inclement weather date: Monday, March 2.

- Both designers must attend.
- We will share all essential event information in advance. Note: there are a few updates this
 year. Each team will be introduced to the artwork they will be interpreting, always a memorable
 moment, then they can view their artwork and enjoy the Museum afterwards.



Arranging and Maintenance

New process this year: the MFA Floral Team will refresh floral arrangements on Friday and Sunday. Each design team must leave a bucket of replacement flowers for updates to your arrangements.

Installation and Pickup:

- Design teams will install their arrangement on the morning of Thursday, April 30, 2026.
- All arrangements must be completed by 9 am on Thursday, April 30.
- Arrangements must be picked up by 9 am on Monday, May 4, 2026.

Maintenance:

- One or two designers from each team must return on Saturday morning for maintenance. Your bucket will be available. Additional floral materials can be brought in for Sunday maintenance.
- Maintenance on Saturday will either 7 am or 8 am, and must be completed within 45 minutes.

Security:

• For security reasons, only designers are permitted in the Museum before opening hours.



Guidelines and Restrictions

Certain works of art may have height or width restrictions. Restrictions will be strictly enforced to ensure the protection of all artwork. Only plant materials may be used.
