#### II. CIVIC DEVELOPMENT - CIVIC BEAUTIFICATION

#### C. CONTINUING CIVIC PROJECTS AWARD (Revised 2018)

Awarded to a GCFM club for continual maintenance of one or more civic projects.

#### D. WILLIAM J. THOMPSON AWARD (1989)

A silver vase in memory of William J. Thompson, awarded for excellence in horticultural achievement and involving education, community planting, or a conservation project. The activity must include others in the community, children, senior citizens, or the public at large.

#### E. CIVIC DEVELOPMENT AND HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANTS (Revised 2018)

The Garden Club Federation of Massachusetts annually funds Civic Development/Historic Preservation grants to state garden clubs for local projects. Funds are provided for seed money to encourage member garden clubs to pursue community improvement and historic preservation planting projects.

<u>Civic Development Grants</u> are for projects that garden clubs will help maintain, such as municipal planting projects, landscaping at schools, libraries, etc., or plantings of labeled trails at nature preserves.

<u>Historic Landscape Preservation Grants</u> are for projects designed to preserve the past in the context of the present, such as improvement of historically significant sites. Projects like restoration of landscaping at historic buildings, creation of historically accurate gardens, or other historic related landscaping projects. For 2024, Grants were given to four clubs.

#### <u>Driftwood Garden Club of Marblehead</u> - The Sandra Joyce Grant (\$1000)

Abbot Library entry garden project with plants selected to minimize maintenance, reduce water consumption, and grow to the right size for the right place - following the adage and teachings of Sandra Joyce.

#### Danvers Garden Club - GCFM Grant (\$1000)

Memorial Garden at Kaplan Family Hospice House renovation project to add low maintenance plantings to four gardens. All club members participate by giving a week's worth of maintenance time during the year.

#### Cambridge Plant & Garden Club - GCFM Grant (\$500)

Hooper-Lee-Nichols House perennial bed refurbishment project to add shade plants, recreating the c.1960 garden plan.

#### Pepperell Garden Club - GCFM Grant (\$500)

Colonial era culinary herb garden project to honor the USA 250th anniversary, located at the Prudence Wright DAR Chapter House. A garden nod to history.
